1. Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to promote a sense of belonging, equality, and pride in our school community. Wearing a uniform helps create a focused learning environment and ensures students are dressed appropriately and safely for school activities. School uniform also ensures that parents and carers know what to send children to school wearing which reduces the conflict when dressing for the day. We ask that parents and carers be mindful of the impact of modern day slavery when buying cost effective school uniform. No child will be refused education at the school due to lack of uniform. School uniform is required but is not mandatory.

2. Uniform Requirements

General Uniform

• Bottoms:

Skirt, formal school trousers, grey or blue gingham pinafore dress, or school shorts (Colour options: Plain Dark Grey or Plain Black)

• Tops:

Formal blouse or shirt, or polo shirt (White)

- Sweatshirts/Cardigans:
 - School logo royal blue sweatshirt
 - School logo cardigan
 - o Plain non-logo royal blue sweatshirt
 - Plain non-logo royal blue cardigan
 - o (Royal Blue No hoodies; these are only used for Year 6)
- Socks/Tights
- Footwear:

Shoes or plain black trainers (Additional colour options: Plain White, Grey, Black, or Blue; Plain Black)

PE & Games Uniform

o Bottoms:

Sports shorts or tracksuit bottoms (Navy blue or black)

o Tops:

T-shirt or polo shirt (White)

Jumper:

Logo quarter zip training top in black, plain black jumper or sweatshirt, school jumper (no hoods)

Trainers:

Plain black trainers (Plain black)

Where to buy uniform:

All uniform items can be bought from supermarkets at a reasonable cost. Branded items are not required but can be purchased at Bridge Schoolwear, Milnsbridge, Huddersfield, HD34PE. Uniform Exchange are a charity which recycles school uniform – they give away school uniform free of charge. School Uniform Support Huddersfield | Uniform Exchange

4. Appearance Guidelines

- Hair should be neat and tied back if long.
- No extreme hairstyles or hair colours.
- Jewellery is limited to small stud earrings and a watch.
- No makeup or nail polish is permitted.

5. Exceptions and Accommodations

- Religious or cultural dress is welcomed and respected. Please inform the school if any adjustments are needed.
- Medical or sensory needs will be accommodated with appropriate documentation.

6. Enforcement

- Staff will monitor uniform compliance.
- Parents/carers will be contacted if a student is not in correct uniform for a period of time.
- Persistent non-compliance will be addressed.
- Staff will be mindful and vigilant for any child without uniform items and approach this with care and understanding for families who may be struggling with cost of living issues.

7. Support

- The school offers support for families who may have difficulty obtaining uniform items. Please contact the school office for assistance. The school website has details of a charity who can supply items of uniform free of charge.
- School uniform is highly recommended but is not mandatory.
